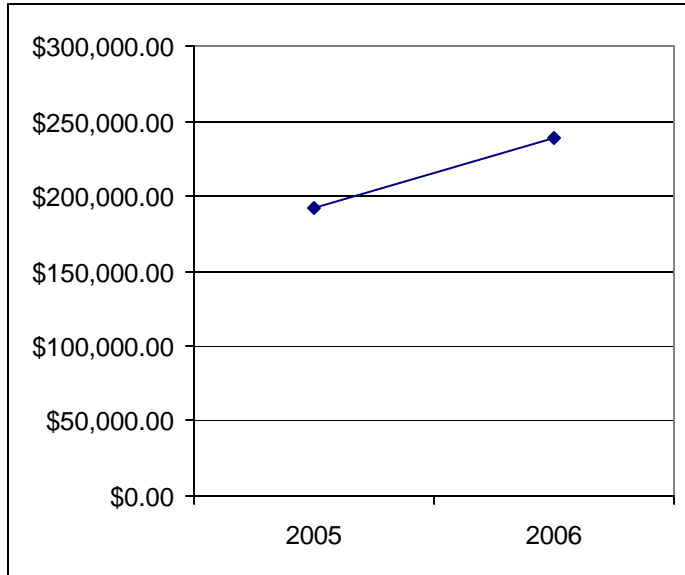
Meeting Frequency
